

FISCAL YEAR: January 1, 2016 to December 31, 2016

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget for the Marlboro Township Fire District No. 1 (the "Fire District") for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2016 and ending December 31, 2016 has been presented before the Board of Commissioners of the Fire District at its open public meeting of December 8, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the budget as introduced is in compliance with the Property Tax Levy Cap Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.44 et. seq.) [Include the following as appropriate: [includes a proposed public referendum in the amount of \$0 in excess of the allowable amount to be raised by taxation] [includes a proposed public referendum in the amount of \$0 as an appropriation from restricted fund balance to be used as budget revenue]; and

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget as introduced reflects Total Revenues of \$1,191,700, which includes an amount to be raised by taxation of \$973,563, and Total Appropriations of \$1,191,700; and

WHEREAS, the amount to be raised by taxation to support the district budget shall be the amount to be certified to the assessor of the municipality to be assessed against the taxable property in the district, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:14-79. Such amount shall be equal to the amount of the total appropriations set forth in the budget minus the total amount surplus and miscellaneous revenues set forth in the budget; and

WHEREAS, in calculating the amount to be raised by taxation, the Fire District has taken into account the assessed valuation of taxable property in the Fire District;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Fire District, at an open public meeting held on December 8, 2015 that the Annual Budget, including all related schedules, of the Fire District for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2016 and ending December 31, 2016 is hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the anticipated revenues as reflected in the Annual Budget are of sufficient amount to meet all proposed expenditures/expenses and all covenants, terms and provisions as stipulated in the Fire District's outstanding debt obligations, capital lease arrangements, service contracts, and other pledged agreements; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of the Fire District will consider the Annual Budget for adoption on January 12, 2016.

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget as presented for adoption reflects each item of revenue and appropriation in the same amount and title as set forth in the introduced and approved budget, including all amendments thereto, if any, which have been approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services; and

WHEREAS, the adopted budget is in compliance with the Property Tax Levy Cap Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.44 et. seq.) [Include as appropriate: [includes a proposed public referendum in the amount of \$0 in excess of the allowable amount to be raised by taxation][includes a proposed public referendum in the amount of \$0 as an appropriation from restricted fund balance to be used as budget revenue]]; and

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget as presented for adoption reflects Total Revenues of \$1,191,700, which includes amount to be raised by taxation of \$973,563, and Total Appropriations of \$1,191,700; and

WHEREAS, an election shall be held annually on the third Saturday of February in each established fire district to determine the amount to be raised by taxation for the ensuing year;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Fire District at an open public meeting held on January 12, 2016 that the Annual Budget of the Fire District for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2016 and ending December 31, 2016, is hereby adopted and, [subject to the proposed referendum being approved by 50 percent of the voters] shall constitute appropriations for the purposes stated and authorization of Total Revenues of \$1,191,700, which includes amount to be raised by taxation of \$973,563, and Total Appropriations of \$1,191,700; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Annual Budget as presented for adoption reflects each item of revenue and appropriation in the same amount and title as set forth in the introduced and approved budget, including all amendments thereto, if any, which have been approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an annual election shall be held on the third Saturday of February to determine the amount to be raised by taxation for the ensuing year. The results of which shall be subsequently certified to the Division and the Municipal Assessor.

The unreserved fund balance is decreased by 8.87% which the District anticipates no impact on the following year's budget.

AGREEMENT AS TO FIRE HOUSE RENTAL

WHEREAS, the Board of Fire Commissioners of Fire District No. 1, Township of Marlboro, County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey, organized pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:14-70, et seq., hereinafter referred to as the COMMISSIONERS, and the Marlboro Fire Company, hereafter referred to as the COMPANY, desire to enter into an Agreement with reference to fire protection in the area known and designated as Fire District No. 1, Township of Marlboro, County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey,

IT IS THEREFORE on this 21" day of April , 2015 hereby AGREED and UNDERSTOOD, as follows:

RENTAL OF FIRE HOUSE

- 1. For and in consideration of the sum of SEVENTY-EIGHT THOUSAND, THREE HUNDRED FORTY........(\$78,340.00).......DOLLARS, and other good and valuable consideration, the COMPANY hereby leases to the COMMISSIONERS that area of the Marlboro Fire House on Highway 79 which is presently used for the housing and garaging of fire fighting equipment and rolling stock owned by the COMMISSIONERS; and, also, the main ballroom thereof for the conduct of the COMMISSIONERS' Meetings, as needed, together with a separate securable area to be utilized as an office for the carrying on of the COMMISSIONERS' business.
- a. It is understood and agreed that, with the exception of the securable office area, the COMPANY is permitted to use that portion of the Marlboro Fire House, leased hereunder to the COMMISSIONERS, for COMPANY affairs on the condition that it furnish suitable substitute facilities for the housing and garaging of the fire fighting equipment and rolling stock during the terms of such use.

- b. It is further understood and agreed that the COMMISSIONERS shall be responsible for the maintenance of all its fire fighting equipment and rolling stock; however, the COMMISSIONERS shall not in any manner be responsible for any maintenance with respect to the premises leased hereunder or any portion thereof.
- c. It is also understood that the COMPANY shall not schedule, or, permit to be held, any affairs, meetings or business in the main ballroom as might interfere or conflict with the conduct of the COMMISSIONERS' Meetings, and in furtherance thereof, there is attached a listing of the COMMISSIONERS' regular meeting schedule through March of 2016. In the event that a special meeting of the COMMISSIONERS is to be scheduled, the COMMISSIONERS shall advise the COMPANY of that date, in writing, at least 14 days in advance of that date, in an attempt to ensure that no interference or conflict will arise with respect to such special meetings.
- 2. It is further understood and agreed that the COMMISSIONERS shall provide at their sole cost and expense:
- a. A Fire Insurance Policy on the entire Fire House premises, including extended coverage and coverage for malicious mischief and vandalism.
- b. A comprehensive General Liability Insurance Policy covering the premises and the operation of the premises by the COMPANY and the COMMISSIONERS for limits of not less than \$1,000,000.00 for injuries to one person and \$1,000,000.00 for injuries to more than one person, in any one accident or occurrence plus \$100,000.00 for each property damage claim and \$2,000,000.00 aggregate property damage coverage.
- c. The COMPANY shall be notified by the COMMISSIONERS in advance of any changes to be made in policy coverage as are presently in effect.
- 3. It is further understood and agreed that the COMPANY shall provide at its sole cost and expense, building maintenance and utilities including but not limited to fuel, gas, and electricity together with all other expenses relating to the premises.

- 4. It is additionally understood and agreed that the COMPANY shall require proof of comprehensive general liability insurance and, where appropriate, workers' compensation insurance, of any hired contractor doing work on said premises.
- 5. It is also understood and agreed that any liability of the COMMISSIONERS under these terms of this Agreement is limited to the Building Rental amount set forth in its budget as approved by public vote at the last regular election of Fire District No. 1, and all rights and duties hereunder are limited to the COMMISSIONERS as a body corporate, no member thereof having assumed any individual liability for the payment of rent.
- 6. Notwithstanding the date of the execution of this Agreement, it is the parties' intention that the Agreement shall be in effect as of the first regular meeting of the COMMISSIONERS following the election held February 21, 2015. This Agreement shall remain in effect for a period of one year and until the COMMISSIONERS' 2016 reorganization meeting.
- 7. It is understood and agreed that the consideration above-mentioned shall be paid by these COMMISSIONERS within a reasonable period following receipt of a Voucher for same from the COMPANY.

It is understood and agreed by and between the parties that a modification of any terms or provisions of this Agreement shall be effective only when made in writing and executed with the same formality as is this Agreement.

By signing below, the President of the COMPANY, the Chairperson of the Board of Trustees of the COMPANY, and the Chairman of the COMMISSIONERS hereby acknowledge having reviewed and understood the terms of this Agreement as respects the duties and obligations of all parties, and agree to be governed thereby.

AGREEMENT AS TO REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES OF VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY MEMBERS

WHEREAS, the Board of Fire Commissioners of Fire District No. 1, Township of Marlboro, County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey, organized pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:14-70, et seq., hereinafter referred to as the COMMISSIONERS, and the Marlboro Fire Company, hereafter referred to as the COMPANY, desire to enter into an Agreement with reference to fire protection in the area known and designated as Fire District No. 1, Township of Marlboro, County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey, and to provide for the maintenance and regulation of the equipment used in connection therewith;

IT IS THEREFORE on this day of , 2015 hereby AGREED and UNDERSTOOD, as follows:

REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES

- 1. It is acknowledged that Members of the COMPANY incur ongoing personal expenses in providing firematic and related services to the residents and businesses of Fire District No. 1 and, also, of surrounding geographical areas under the concept of "mutual aid".
- 2. It is also acknowledged that such personal expenses include and entail costs for uniform maintenance and clothing allowance, personal equipment and tools not provided by the COMPANY, travel and fuel expenditures, and time away from employment resulting from responding on needed calls, amongst other things.
- 3. It is additionally agreed between the parties that upon receipt of an appropriate Voucher from the COMPANY, the COMMISSIONERS will pay the COMPANY TWELVE THOUSAND(\$12,000.00)....... DOLLARS to match an equal contribution from the COMPANY of TWELVE THOUSAND(\$12,000.00)...... DOLLARS, based upon an allotment of up to \$550.00 per Member during the calendar year January 1, 2015 December 31,

2015 to defray these personal expenses.

- 4. It is further agreed that reimbursements to the Members will be in accordance with a schedule maintained by the Chief of the COMPANY, or by his/her designated representative, requiring that besides receiving the consent of the Chief or his/her designee, each Line Officer and each Member of the COMPANY maintain a COMPANY attendance average to be eligible for any reimbursement the attendance average being 50% for each Line Officer and 40% for each Company Member. Any of the \$12,000.00 advanced by the COMMISSIONERS that is not distributed as a matched reimbursement of expenses by the COMPANY incurred through December 31, 2015 shall be applied as an offset against reimbursements in any renewal or extension of this Agreement covering the year January 1, 2016 December 31, 2016, and beyond. The Chief of the COMPANY or his/her designee is to provide the COMMISSIONERS with a report of, and explaining of, all reimbursements under this Section at the time of the COMMISSIONERS' regularly scheduled Meeting in January 2016, or at a mutually agreed to later date and at regular scheduled January meetings thereafter.
- 5. It is additionally agreed that either the Chief of the COMPANY or his/her designated representative shall attend each Meeting of the COMMISSIONERS to report on the prior month's activity of the COMPANY and to comment on any questions raised thereat regarding COMPANY matters.

It is understood and agreed by and between the parties that a modification of any terms or provisions of this Agreement shall be effective only when made in writing and executed with the same formality as is this Agreement.

AGREEMENT AS TO FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT & ROLLING STOCK

WHEREAS, the Board of Fire Commissioners of Fire District No. 1, Township of Marlboro, County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey, hereinafter referred to as the COMMISSIONERS and the Fire Chief, Deputy Chief, Captain, Lieutenant, and Chief Engineer of Marlboro Fire Company, hereinafter referred to as the LINE OFFICERS, desire to enter into an Agreement with reference to fire protection in the area known and designated as Fire District No. 1, Township of Marlboro, County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey, and to provide for the maintenance of the equipments used in connection therewith;

IT IS THEREFORE on this 12 day of My, 2015, for and in consideration of the sum of ONE DOLLAR AND NO/00 (\$1.00) each to each other paid and receipt of which is acknowledged, hereby AGREED and UNDERSTOOD as follows:

- 1. The removal of the fire fighting equipment and rolling stock from the Firehouse on Route 79 in Marlboro Township or from any other location where they may be maintained —, for any purpose, is to be at the discretion of the Fire Chief, or his authorized representative. Any removal of such equipment and stock from the Fire District shall also be at the discretion of the Fire Chief, or his authorized representative, provided, however, that at no time shall the Fire District be left without adequate fire fighting protection.
- a. In the event that it is desired to remove such equipment and stock from the District for attendance at parades, wet downs, training matters, memorial or other celebratory functions, request to do so must first be made to at least one of Michael MacDonald, John Borden and Douglas Tilton, the Commissioners on the Equipment Committee of the Board of Fire Commissioners, verbally or in writing, and not less than 14 days in advance of the date when such removal is sought, if and when possible, except when emergent conditions arise. Approval of the Equipment Committee Commissioner contacted shall be sufficient to permit removal of such

alcohol or drugs, in performing such duty, whether out on a regular call or at any parade or other occasional function. Additionally, and under no circumstances, shall alcoholic beverages of any type be maintained, stored, kept or otherwise be present in any such equipment or rolling stock, whether inside the firehouse or outside, and whether on call or on any functional occasion.

- 2. All fire fighting equipment and rolling stock owned by the COMMISSIONERS shall be maintained by the COMMISSIONERS in an acceptable state of readiness and acceptability for use. Any repairs required in the ordinary course of fire fighting activities and in the day-to-day use of the equipment and stock may be acted upon, and ordered by the Fire Chief, except for the arranging of major repairs to the equipment and stock.
- a. In arranging for such ordinary repairs -- which shall be paid for by the COMMISSIONERS -- the Fire Chief shall utilize, as much as feasibly possible -- those entities as are approved for purposes of State Bidding.
- b. In all instances where the Fire Chief has authorized repairs, reports thereof shall be timely communicated to the COMMISSIONERS, and not later than at the next Regular Meeting of the COMMISSIONERS following the authorization given to make needed repairs.
- 3. No tool, machinery, equipment or other property owned by the COMMISSIONERS is to be taken from the Firehouse, except in connection with a fire-call, or in connection with an appearance authorized in conjunction with a parade, wet-down, etc.
- 4. No tool, machinery, equipment or other property belonging to the COMMISSIONERS is to be taken from any fire-truck or other motor vehicle owned by the COMMISSIONERS for any reason, other than in connection with a fire-call or other authorized use of such tool, machinery, equipment or other property.
- 5. All members of the Fire Company shall be responsible for any and all equipment individually issued to them for use. Loss of such equipment may be held against the Company by the COMMISSIONERS, depending upon the circumstances thereof.
- 6. It is expressly understood and agreed that it is the responsibility of the LINE OFFICERS to carry out the provisions of Paragraphs 3, 4 and 5.

- 7. By signing below, the Fire Chief, for himself and for the other LINE OFFICERS, accepts the responsibility for carrying out the terms of this Agreement, and represents that the terms of the Agreement are complied with by the Fire Chief, his authorized representative and/or the other LINE OFFICERS.
- 8. It is understood and agreed by and between the COMMISSIONERS and the LINE OFFICERS that a modification of any terms or provisions of this Agreement shall be effective only when made in writing, and executed with the same formality as is this Agreement.
